HSVA makes no warranties express or implied, including the warranty of fitness for any particular purpose, and the Buyer agree to purchase *horse described above* "as is". Once this agreement is signed and agreed upon by both parties, HSVA is *no longer responsible* for the care or maintenance of said horse.

HSVA requires two written references from Buyer *before* agreement can be signed:

Personal Reference: HSVA may contact them for more information if needed. (cannot be a relative).

Veterinarian Reference: HSVA may contact them for more information if needed.

Full payment for said horse must be received by HSVA *before* horse may be transported to Buyers stable (unless a separate agreement is made between HSVA and Buyer to set up a payment plan).

In the event that the Buyer is not able to complete the transaction in full, the ownership of the horse will remain with HSVA. The agreement is then nullified and void.

HSVA requires an update on said horse after one year with new owner (buyer): this update must include current photos, updated veterinarian records, and any other pertinent information HSVA requests. HSVA retains the right to check in and request updates on said horse at throughout its life. This includes, but is not limited to: phone calls, photos, stable check-ins, etc.

If the Buyer seeks to sell/rehome said horse at a later date, Buyer can return said horse to HSVA at no additional charge **OR** HSVA retains the right to purchase said horse back from Buyer (for the same price agreed to in this document), claiming "first right of refusal".

This is valid for the lifetime of the horse.

Any individual or organization in possession of the equine as of the date of the agreement and any time thereafter is bound to not sell the equine at auction for slaughter or allow the equine to be sold, transferred, released, or otherwise placed into possession of any person or organization that will cause or allow the equine to be sold at auction for slaughter.
